## **SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT**

## **School Responsibilities**

#### The Deal School will:

- Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:
  - Students identified as Title 1 students will participate in a before or after school
    enrichment program that will target student deficiencies in an effort to improve their basic
    educational skills.
  - Title 1 students will be exposed to both Achieve 3000 and ST Math to target student skills and and provide them with the enrichment that is needed to allow them to perform to state standards.
  - Teachers will use data driven instruction from the Achieve 3000 and ST Math programs, as well as, data gathered through the administration of local benchmark assessments to individual student programs and instruction.
- 2. Hold parent-teacher conferences (at least annually in elementary schools) during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:
  - Parent teacher conferences will be formally held in conjunction with regularly scheduled school parent/teacher conferences in November.

- Title 1 parents will be able to sign up to meet specifically with the Title 1 teacher.
- 3. **Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress.** Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
  - Programs utilized for the Title 1 instruction allows for parent access and the print out of progress reports that will be available to parents on a regular basis.
  - Parents will receive progress reports associated with local benchmark assessments to show student progress.
- 4. **Provide parents reasonable access to staff.** Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:
  - Teachers will be available during parent/teacher conferences.
  - Teachers will maintain different modes of communication including phone calls, face to face conferences during mutually convenient times, and via email.
- 5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
  - Parents will be given the opportunity to participate in classroom activities and projects
    when appropriate. The title 1 teacher will extend invites for parents to participate both in
    the classroom and at home to be active in their child's learning.
  - Family Education Nights will be explored and implemented to draw parents into the classroom and to involve them in student learning.

#### **Parent Responsibilities**

## We, as parents, will support our children's learning in the following ways:

- Monitoring attendance.
- Making sure that homework is completed.
- Monitoring amount of television their children watch.
- Volunteering in my child's classroom.
- Participating, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my children's education.
- Promoting positive use of my child's extracurricular time.
- Staying informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child or by mail and responding, as appropriate.
- Serving, to the extent possible, on policy advisory groups, such as being the Title I, Part
  A parent representative on the school's School Improvement Team, the Title I Policy
  Advisory Committee, the District wide Policy Advisory Council, the State's Committee
  of Practitioners, the School Support Team or other school advisory or policy groups.

#### Student Responsibilities (revise as appropriate to grade level)

We, as students, will share the responsibility to improve our academic achievement and achieve the State's high standards. Specifically, we will:

The Deal School will:

- 1. Involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of the school's parental involvement policy, in an organized, ongoing, and timely way.
